Competition concept

The aim of the contest was to investigate the models and patterns of interaction of the existing cultural monuments, signs anf symbols with the current architectural ex[ression systems as to catalyze authenticity and identity of time and place.

Aims of the competition

The competition analyzed examples of symbolic and significant forms in Mexican architecture. The participants discussed the meaning of the sign found in the historic haciennda and how they had been manifested and detected. The objective was to apply this knowledge to the revitalization and rehabilitation of a traditional hacienda-El Cazadero complex, located close by the town of San Juan del Rio, Queretaro.

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
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Our proposal


